





FY 2019-2021 Budget


The City of Roeland Park is working on the budget for FY 2019-2021. The City adopts a multi-year budget annually to ensure that the City's financial outlook remains structurally balanced. Below is a snapshot of the City's Proposed Budget and Capital Improvements Program (CIP) for 2019 as well as the Goals and Objectives adopted by Council.



Capital Improvements Program


Between 2018 and 2022, the City plans to spend **\$20.7 million** to improve roads, facilities, storm sewers and parks and recreation amenities and purchase equipment to help carry out municipal duties all without issuing General Obligation Bonds. Programs are prioritized based partly on results from the Citizen Survey and the availability of grant funds.

\$14.73 million...

Investment in street improvements over the next 5 years. The largest investment is the Roe Boulevard reconstruction in 2020 at \$8.19 million followed by \$1.65 million for Roe Lane improvements in 2018.

Here's how the remaining \$5.97 million investment will be spent.

5 Year CIP Investment by Category




CIP by Funding Source

of the 5 year CIP is funded using federal and local grants and private fundraising through the Citizen's Initiative for R Park. \$7.2 million of the total \$7.5 million comes from the County Assistance Road System (CARS) and Surface Transportation Program (STP).

Budget must be finalized and sent to the County by August 25th annually
