

Aquatic Center Update



The Roeland Park City Council has been working on determining the future for the pool operations understanding that the Johnson County Parks and Recreation District will no longer continue with its joint-funding agreement after the contract expires in May 2019. After conducting a cost analysis and receiving bids from the insurance agency to repair the Aquatic Center's damaged dome, it has been determined that the Aquatic Center will not be open for the 2018-2019 winter season.

The Council put a lot of thought into this decision since the aquatic center's winter season has benefitted many community members and surrounding programs, including the Bishop Miege High School swim team. Ultimately, the cost to repair the aquatic dome and meet the recommended safety standards exceeds the City's budget for this coming winter.

Residents are encouraged to contact the JCPRD Board to voice their support for a Roeland Park – JCPRD Partnership, as well as any other resources that would allow the City to fund winter season operations for the Aquatic Center. Mayor Kelly and the Councilmembers are committed to looking for solutions through potential partnerships and various resources that would enable the City to resume the Aquatic Center for future winter seasons.

June 4th: Revised Budget Presentation (If Needed) - if major revisions occur following Community Workshop and Special Budget Workshop

Council Workshop: Consent of Council to Publish Notice of Budget Hearing (setting Mill Levy)

June 11th: Publish Budget Hearing in Legal Record

July 16th: Public Hearing on Proposed Budget (At council Meeting) - Consider adoption of 2019 Proposed Budget

July 20th: Submit approved budget to County Clerk (Must be filed no later than August 24th)

MAYOR'S REPORT

Happy summer! This is a great time of year to celebrate. We proudly recognize this season's major holidays, but also enjoy the season simply because of the company of our neighbors. Good weather means front porches, barbecues, and block parties. Last year, I was lucky to be invited to several block parties in Roeland Park, and I found these gatherings wonderful opportunities to not only meet new neighbors, but also reconnect with those friends you miss in the day-to-day shuffle. Currently, the Governing Body is working on next year's budget. I am proud to say that Roeland Park's financial position is strong. Our 2019 preliminary budget maintains requisite reserves and pays off the City's debts while incurring no new bonds. Additionally, our preliminary budget accomplishes many of the goals you asked for: Progressively lowering the mill levy, providing a modest raise to our talented employees to keep them on par with other municipalities, and continuing the beautification of our parks.

We also are proposing the addition of new programs to help residents in need. Neighbors Helping Neighbors uses the newly formed Youth Advisory Committee to organize volunteer projects and help residents with minor property maintenance issues. Additionally, the Property Tax Assistance Program would help those residents who exhibit genuine hardship to pay increased property tax bills due to our extremely high property tax assessment increases.

I am proud of the Governing Body's leadership and cooperation in pursuing these programs because first and foremost, we are all neighbors. We'll continue to look out for our neighbors, just as our neighbors look out for us.

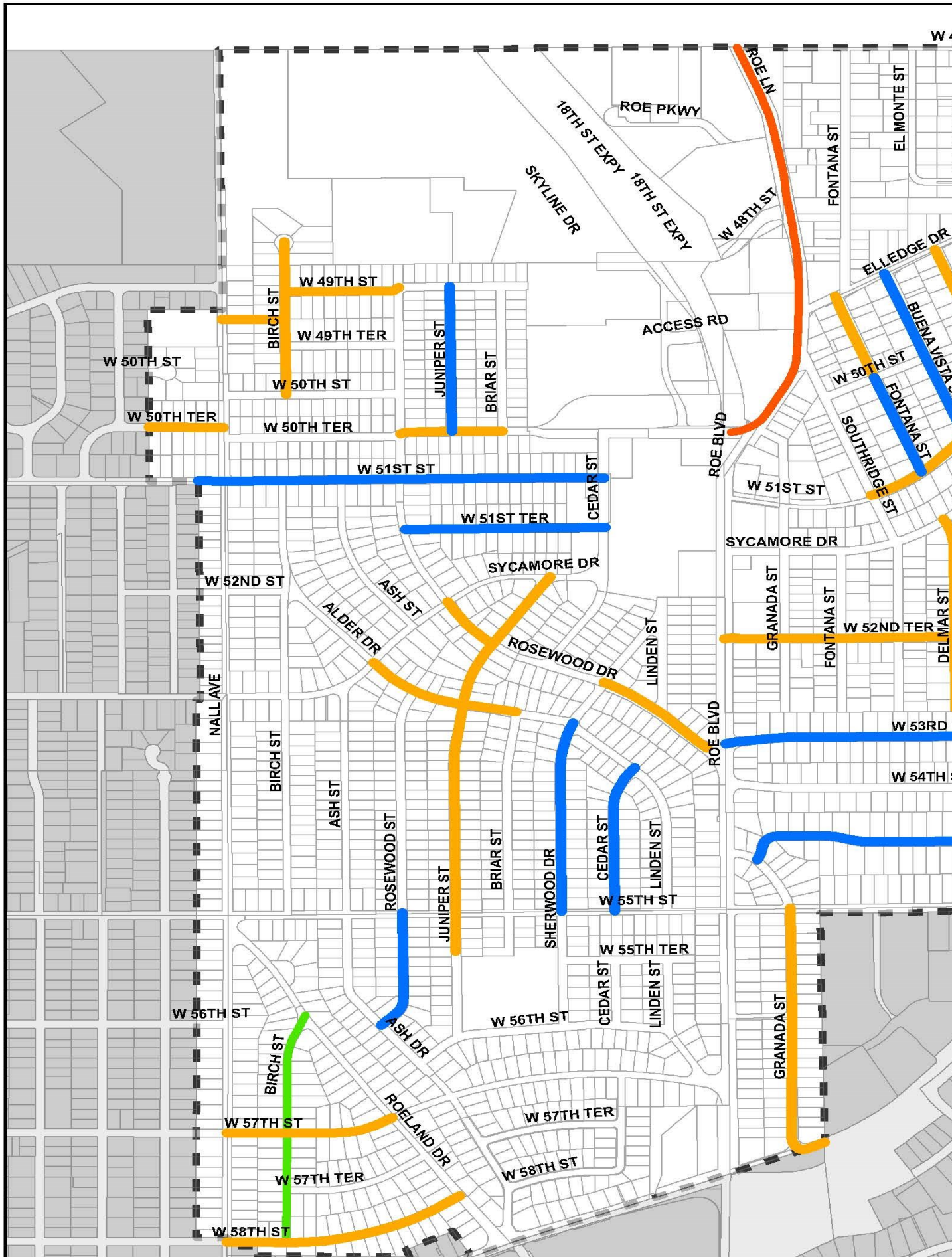

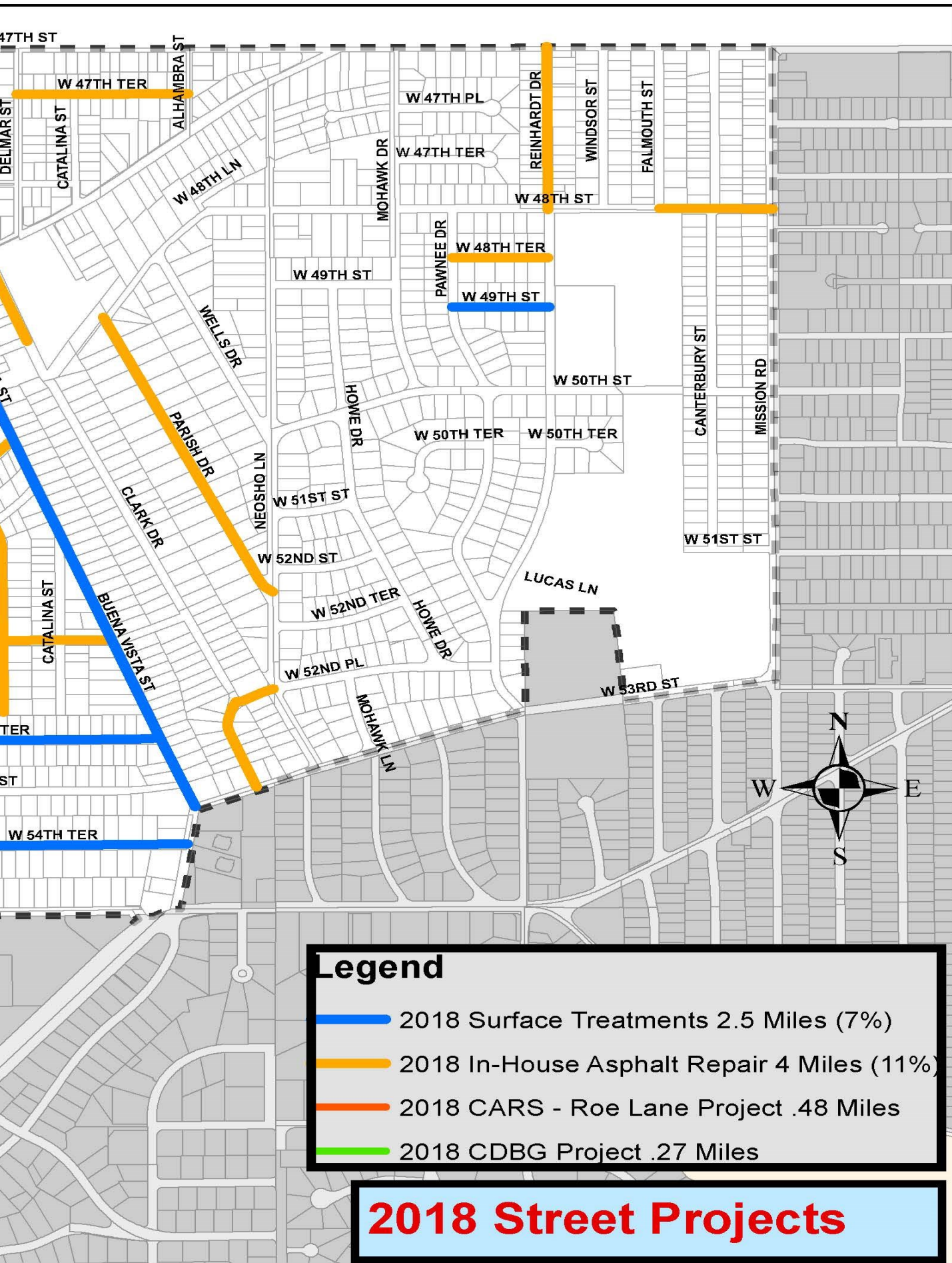


2018 Fall Leaf Pickup Program

Introducing an Engaging Sculpture for R Park: A Testament to Joy!

A new, colorful and joyful sculpture, symbolizing revitalization in the Roeland Park community, will be installed in R Park in the spring of 2019. This sculpture will fulfill the first of 7 public art focal points designated in the R Park Master Plan and will join with future art pieces, some created by local and regional artists.

This sculpture project, led by Citizens Sculpture Initiative for R Park with guidance from the Arts Advisory Committee of Roeland Park, will be funded entirely by grants and tax-deductible private and business contributions. This sculpture, a gift to the City of Roeland Park, has received the unanimous support of Mayor Mike Kelly and the City Council. It has also been endorsed by the Arts Council of Johnson County.

Internationally acclaimed and award winning sculptor Jorge Blanco was commissioned to design an iconic sculpture specifically for R Park. The playful

and active figure of the runner in his design symbolizes the forward movement and progress of the City of Roeland Park and will act as a welcoming herald for visitors who come to the park for fun, fitness and community engagement. Three Rs on the rings represent the conventional 3 Rs of Reading, 'Riting, and 'Rithmetic as a tribute to all teachers and students, locally and globally, and a reference to Roeland Park Elementary school, formerly on the site. The figure, standing 5-6' tall on 8' posts, will be made of heavy aluminum with a durable powder-coated paint finish that can withstand extreme temperatures and allow for easy maintenance. The piece is expected to last more than 50 years.

Tax-deductible donations for this \$56,000 sculpture project can be made payable to "Roeland Park Community Foundation," memo on check: "R Park Sculpture" and mailed to Roeland Park City Hall, 4600 W. 51st Street, Roeland Park, Kansas 66205. Credit card donations can be made online or in person at Roeland Park City Hall.

Jorge Blanco is known for making sculpture that captures the energy and vitality of the human spirit. Using bright colors and clean shapes, his creations evoke a playfulness that is inviting to children and to all people with a playful heart. Blanco, a Venezuelan-born American citizen, has created outdoor sculpture for over 30 years. His work can be seen in more than 30 cities around the world, including Leawood, Kansas.

Jorge Blanco will visit Roeland Park in late July, 2018, to consult with Citizens Sculpture Initiative for R Park, the Arts Advisory Committee, Public Works, and the Parks Committee regarding the ideal location for the sculpture in R Park. During Blanco's visit, an event is planned for Roeland Park citizens to meet and engage with the artist. Blanco will make a second visit to Roeland Park in the late spring of 2019 to supervise the installation of the sculpture.

Roeland Park Police K9 Update

The Roeland Park Police Department is excited to announce that enough funds have been raised to begin the police canine program. Thanks to generous community donors, several non-profit organizations, and a partnership with the Lenexa Police Department, this goal will allow the police department to purchase a canine in 2018 rather than 2019 as originally projected.

The Lenexa Police Department has offered to assist in the canine selection process, and has also invited the newly selected canine to join their canine police training free of cost. We are very grateful to Corporal Summer and the rest of the Lenexa Police Department for extending this opportunity for a meaningful partnership.

A police canine marks a vital addition to the police force that will offer additional protection to the police officers and citizens. The canine will be trained in narcotics detection as well as other patrol related duties including tracking, building searches, suspect apprehension, and crime prevention.

Roeland Park Police Department is looking forward to this journey and will update the community on the progress the canine is making throughout the training program.
