City Installs New Gateway Art Piece

"Origin" by artist Nathan Pierce was installed on March 5th at the north entrance to the City on Roe Boulevard. The piece was selected as one of three finalists by the Arts Advisory Committee after a call for proposals to place a signature art piece at the north gateway of the City. Of the three, "Origin" was selected by the City Council.

"When I was selected as the artist for the Roeland Park, Kansas, Gateway Project I was filled with immense pride and honor. Drawing inspiration from the natural beauty of the region, "Origin" will stand as an inviting monumental gateway into the city. The work is crafted from stainless steel and cast acrylic panels. The vibrant blue and green acrylic symbolizes the significance of the natural environment in fostering community growth and identity."

QQ CITY VOLUNTEERS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

The City of Roeland Park is successful, in part, thanks to many dedicated citizens who are doing amazing work all the time in our community. These committees help drive policy in key areas and influence services offered in our community. Here's a taste of the interesting work being done by our standing committees.

Helping the City Meet Climate Action Goals

The City **Sustainability Committee** members don't just talk about reducing carbon emissions, they live it. As part of the 2025 Budget, the Committee is proposing to do a carbon emissions assessment for City facilities, and work with an expert to help develop a plan to meet the ambitious goals set out in the Regional Climate Action Plan. This plan would help guide City infrastructure investment to reach Net Zero carbon emissions for municipal facilities by 2030. The Sustainability Committee will be key in reviewing proposals and facilitating the process for the City.



Focusing on Equity in All Areas

The **Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Committee** is lending an extra set of eyes to assist Council with assessing the equity implications for City policies and ordinances. Their goals for 2024 are 1) to open lines of communication with the community and 2) to provide an equity lens to City policies. In fact, the committee has already provided valuable insights to Council in its process of reviewing the City code that have been integrated into the recommended changes.



Adding an Artistic Element to our Public Spaces

Our **Arts Advisory Committee** is busy! The City relies on these local volunteers to provide their expertise in programming the \$25,000 annual budget for the purchase and

maintenance of public art in Roeland Park. The Committee has taken the lead in commissioning murals and sculptures throughout the City, including the 47th Street Mural, the mural on the Aldi stairway on Roe Ln, and the latest installation - "Origin". The committee intends to embark on a Public Art Master Plan in 2025 which will guide the City's future placement and investment in public art into the future.

Setting the Standard for Aquatics in RP

The City took over operation of the RPAC in 2019 from Johnson County Parks & Recreation. Since then, the **Aquatics Center Advisory Committee**, has helped to guide the policy

decisions and make recommendations to the City Council on user fees, programming, and facility offerings. The Aquatics Advisory Committee is currently working on developing and scheduling new events to implement this summer.



Driving the Process for Public Input

Nall Park is soon to get a makeover and the **Parks & Trees Committee** is leading the charge to determine what Nall Park will look like in the future. The City Engineer is working with the Committee on developing the Nall Park Master Plan and helping to determine avenues for public feedback which will help drive the plan.

The piece was funded in part through the City's 1% for Art Program, which states that all new commercial facilities built in Roeland Park contribute 1% of the total construction cost to a piece of public art. The business can purchase their own art to display on their property or they can contribute their 1% to the City's public art program for a future installation

that would be maintained by the City. All works must be accessible to the public.

2024 Roeland Park Aquatic Season Updates

We are excited for the RPAC to open on May 25th and want to update you all on a few changes to expect for the 2024 season. We are happy to announce that we are committed to being open seven days a week throughout the summer. The RPAC already has the staffing levels to do so and is currently training and certifying lifeguards, facility attendants, and managers to operate throughout the summer.

Super Pass Updates

Due to staffing issues and registration challenges last summer, the City will not participate in the Super Pass program in 2024. While this may be disappointing news for some of our patrons, we are adding new programming that we think you will enjoy.

New Programming

New programming and fun events will happen at the RPAC all summer long! This includes swim lessons, deep water aerobics, as well as a family movie night and an adult only night in partnership with a local watering hole – more details coming!

Passes & Pricing

We are decreasing our rates for individuals and families! This year, individual season passes are only \$35 for residents and \$45 for non-residents. Those 60 years and older can get a resident pass for only \$30 or \$40 for a non-resident. The family season passes are \$125 for residents and \$165 for non-residents for up to a family of five. Additional household members can be purchased for an additional fee. We hope these savings will allow more community members to enjoy the RPAC!

Changes Coming to Mission Road

Mission Road improvements from 47th St to 53rd St are planned for 2025 construction. The project, in partnership with the City of Westwood, entails spot curb repair/replacement, sidewalk repair, asphalt base repairs, mill & overlay, streetlighting, and planned marked bike lanes. The program is anticipating funding in part through Johnson County's County Assistance Road Project (CARS) grant which supports street improvements throughout the county on arterial and collector streets.

The design was developed after soliciting feedback from residents and those who use Mission Road and is in compliance with Bike-

Ped Plans for the Cities of Roeland Park and Westwood. The City Council is working to finalize design plans. The project is expected to start in the Spring of 2025 and be complete by Fall.
