## D. Unfinished Business

1. 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary – Decide on projects for 2026 – AAC discussed these projects

  2. Art for the City Hall Lobby. Install before the anniversary in August.

2. Citywide Art Contest – Results from over 100 public votes are:

2. Strategic Planning Roundtable at October AAC meeting – Ruanda Mc Ferren with Porchlight will attend the meeting as part of the current RP strategic planning process.
3. Kathleen Whitworth Memorial Tree Proposal – Mary will coordinate with Parks and Public Works on obtaining and deciding on a memorial tree for this deceased RP resident who did many good things our city. May be able to get a tree through the 'Contain the Rain' program. May also want to look at other memorial tree installations in Sweeney Park and Nall Park to see how they are done. Do we want to consider a memorial forest in our planning?
4. "See Red Run" Cleaning – Paul Benson will start mentoring a person who does art cleaning for City of Leawood so they can take over periodic cleaning of our more valuable sculptures.
